A GROUP of multicultural artists based in New York, the Barefoot Theatre Company produces and stages thought-provoking theatre performances across the world. Their latest musical play in India, *The Legend of Ila*, is a performance inspired from the dusty pages of the *Puranas*. The play is performed by Subhadra Kamath, Adhiraj Mustafi, and Anant Dayal and they have also written the script. The soul of the play lies in a combination of words and music presented in the English language, but the performers call it 'a story in song', inspired by oral traditions around the world, which often use music as an integral device of storytelling.



As one of the performers of the play, Anant Dayal states, "What's important for me is that the whole question of gender studies, since our birth has only given people an intellectual experience and basic assumption on gender issues. My aim is to open people's eyes beyond the textbook sense of gender spectrum."
